Before the War:

At the bazaar. 1920-30s Sloboda Ukraine. Kharkiv region. In Galicia, there was more cultural diversity (Ukrainians, Poles, Jews, Germans), which led to the merging of different styles: folk and modern army / military styles. As the majority of Ukrainian still lives in villages in that time, the Ukrainian culture, along with its national clothing, has preserved better in that region













To sum up:

- 1. Rapid industrialization and war shortages led to more utilitarian designs, compared to fancy fashion before.
- 2. War clothing became more popular and continued to be popular even after
- 3. Soviet ideology in the USSR, which emphasized collective identity and discouraged showing any wealth
